#### **Attendance**

You will receive letters today which show your child's attendance this term. We are so lucky that the vast majority of children have excellent attendance here at Dunnington and understand the importance of attending school. Coming to school everyday helps children to have fun, learn, make new friends and experience new things. Even missing a few afternoons can make it much harder for your child to keep up with their learning and fully enjoy school.

We absolutely do not want you to send your child to school if they are unwell and really appreciate your support with this to try to prevent illnesses spreading around school. We understand that after a term, a nasty illness can have an effect on the percentage attendance your child has and we do always look at the reasons behind a child's absence when analysing attendance. On the whole, good attendance is considered to be above 96%, and we are particularly worried when attendance slips below 90%, when a child is classed as a persistent absentee.

If we are worried about your child's attendance, we will get in touch to see if there is anything we can do to support. Likewise, if you have any concerns or questions about your child's attendance, please do not hesitate to get in touch.
