Dear parent/ carer,

Happy New Year! I hope you all had a wonderful festive break and managed to enjoy some rest amongst all the Christmas business. We are really looking forward to our open afternoon on Wednesday 22nd January. This is an opportunity for you to visit your child's classroom after school (between 3:30pm and 5:00pm) and look at your child's work. Our House Point System

In 2018, our school council worked with the pupil body to introduce a new house point system throughout the school. They decided that, on entry to school, all pupils would be allocated to one of four houses: Craven (Green), Rowntree (Yellow), Terry (Blue) or Tuke (Red). The houses were named after famous confectioners in the York area.

House points form a part of our whole school reward system at Dunnington CE Primary School. Events, such as sports day, bring children together to compete in their houses. The house system encourages a team ethos across the school and allows children of all ages to have a common goal.

Whilst we expect all children to be ready to learn, respectful and safe at all times, our house points are used to reward children for 'taking that extra step' for example;

- Helping and caring for others
- Demonstrating high levels of enthusiasm, courtesy, collaboration or cooperation
- Persevering with a challenge
- Striving to improve.

Congratulations to all in **Rowntree House** who had gained the most points when we broke up for Christmas. In assembly this week, they chose a breakfast with the headteacher as their reward. We will hold this breakfast on Thursday 16th January (in school time) – I have been told that chocolate croissants are a must!

As you may know, the school receives funding to allow any EYFS, year 1 or year 2 child to have free school meals. This funding is calculated from



the number of pupils who order a school lunch on the three census days throughout the year so it is really important for our budget that as many children choose a school dinner on these days as possible.

If your child is unsure about trying a school lunch, they are welcome to bring in a packed lunch as well that they can have if they do not enjoy the school lunch.
