World Down Syndrome Day

Everyone is looking fabulous and utterly unique in their odd or bright socks today. Thank you to Miss Dickenson for bulking up the staff collection of amazing socks.

In Collective Worship this morning, we learned a little bit more about Down syndrome. We learned that every single person is unique and that this is something that should be celebrated. We learned that babies are born with Down syndrome, and will always have it. We learned that children with Down syndrome share some physical characteristics, but they look more like their families than each other. We also learned that there are people all over the world with Down syndrome.

We then learned about the causes of Down syndrome – we found out that most people have 23 pairs of chromosomes, making 46 altogether, in every single cell in their bodies. We discovered that these



chromosomes are really important as they decide lots of things about us, like whether we will be male or female. A person with Down syndrome is born with an extra chromosome in every cell, so instead of 46 individual chromosomes they have 47.

We were told that children with Down syndrome go to school, watch TV, have friends, love to play, have feelings and are just like everyone else! They might find some things, like speaking, remembering or understanding, a little tricky at times, but they will still be able to learn – it just might take a little longer.

We then listened to Chloe, explaining what Down syndrome is

(https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=_r_2rmDYfz4). The children were really inspired by this video. Chloe told us that only 1 in 1000 babies are born with Down syndrome in the whole wide world and that she was one of those lucky babies! She told us that we need to be patient and just ask if someone with Down syndrome needs help – sometimes they will want help, and sometimes, they will really want to do something on their own. She told us that she loves to play and have fun and we just need to treat her in the same way as everyone else. What a wonderful lesson for all of us to live by!
