Year Group: 6

Term and Duration: Summer 1

Theme: World War 2

Celebration: WW2 – Food, costumes, dance (Jitterbug) and music

English Objectives

<u>**Reading**</u> – Whole class reading will be based on 'Letters from the Lighthouse' written by Emma Carroll. It is a story set during the Second World War.

The children will be taught to:

- Understand the meaning of new vocabulary in texts
- Predict what might happen from details stated and implied
- Draw **inference** such as inferring characters' feelings, thoughts and motives from their actions, and justifying inferences with **evidence**.
- Check that the book makes sense to them, discussing understanding and exploring the meaning of words in context.
- **Summarise** the main ideas drawn from more than one paragraph, identifying key details that support the main ideas.

In addition, the children will be reading and discussing extracts from a range of genres. This will increase the children's understanding of texts relating to weekly themes.

Writing-

Our focus writing tasks will link to a variety of creative hooks and sources, such as videos and texts. The children will complete writing in the following genres:

- Book Review
- Descriptive Narrative
- Information text
