FINAL REMINDER - Google Services

You received a letter at the start of March explaining that Google has introduced a new requirement regarding access to their services for users under the age of 18. These services include YouTube, Google Photos, Google Maps, Google Translate, and others.

As outlined in their policy: "Our Google Workspace for Education Terms of Service require your organization to obtain parental consent before turning on additional Google services for users under 18 years of age.

Thank you to those of you who have already completed the form confirming consent for your child to access these additional services. We have given out a new copy of the form to any pupils we have not yet received consent for. Please could these be completed and returned as soon as possible.

Please note that all SYMAT schools have extensive monitoring and filtering in place to protect all our children from harmful content and notifications are received if children have tried to access any material of concern.




Message from the PTA - Smarties Challenge!
