Re-arranged date - On Monday 9th June, pupils in KS2 will be taking part in a range of activities to celebrate the life and works of Shakespeare, all run by the wonderful Gemma Curry of Hoglets Theatre.

All pupils in Year 3 and 4 will experience an interactive workshop titled: Shakespeare is Awesome! Developed originally for the Bradford Literature Festival, this engaging session explores Shakespeare's life, language, and audience.

Pupils in Year 5 and 6 will experience a workshop and play titled: 'Spooky Shakespeare Suitcase Theatre.' Hags, hauntings, hobgoblins and more emerge from the spooky suitcase owned by Lady Macbeth (Dotty to her friends).
