Survey results and future plans

Thank you to those of you who have completed surveys recently about the school generally and about playtimes. Your feedback makes such a difference and really does help us to drive the school forward taking everyone's views on board.

ADHD T FOUNDATION ADHD Friendly School When we completed the parent/carer survey in the Spring term, the main area where parents/ carers thought we could improve was communication, particularly regarding parent consultations. We intend to send out a more detailed questionnaire specifically about communication in September to help us to fully understand concerns and make the right decisions about communication and parents' evenings going forward.

Thank you to those who have responded to our play survey – these views, combined with the views shared by pupils and staff – are helping us to make sure the changes we make to playtime really do benefit everyone, especially the children.

The main headlines from the parental survey so far are that:

- 89% of parents think playtime is extremely important
- 84% of parents would like children to have trees to climb
- 59% of parents would like there to be more ball games in addition to football
- 50% of parents would like there to be more social areas in the playground
- 73% of parents approve/ strongly approve of muddy clothes/ minor accidents that happen as the result of playing

We had an OPAL meeting earlier this week, where we discussed our action plan and next steps, and we are set to have a planning meeting in a couple of weeks to consider how best to use our amazing grounds.

We will be completing training throughout the Autumn term which will allow us to safely introduce play such as tree climbing later in the year. From September, we will have the following in place in addition to the normal sports and activities children currently do at playtime:

- Dressing up clothes
- Cardboard area
- Chess

To make this possible, it is essential that all children have waterproofs and wellies in school as part of their school uniform from September.
