#### Highlights from the last two weeks

#### **Statutory Assessments**

Over the course of the last term, children in several year groups have sat statutory assessments, such as the year 1 phonics screen, the year 4 multiplication check and the year 6 SATS. We are really proud of the results achieved, which are testament to the incredible hard work of our pupils and staff and the support from families at home.

In EYFS, 76% of children achieved a Good Level of Development, in year 1, 71% of children passed the phonics screener and 100% of children have now passed in year 2. The year 4 multiplication check was out of 25 - 41% of children achieved full marks, 59% scored either 24 or 25 and 91% scored above 20. Our average score was an amazing 23!

In year 6, 89% of children achieved expected level or above in reading compared to 75% nationally, 83% of pupils achieved expected level or above in writing compared to 72% nationally, 86% of children achieved expected level or above in grammar, punctuation and spelling compared to 73% nationally and 80% of pupils achieved expected level or above in maths compared to 74% nationally. 80% of children achieved an expected level or above in reading, writing and maths combined, compared to 62% nationally and 17% of children achieved greater depth in reading, writing and maths combined. We could not be prouder of you year 6.

A full break down of results compared to national data will be shared on the website once we have all the data available to us.



Well done to our footballers in year 4 who competed in the final at Wiggington earlier this week. Whilst they did not win, they were only beaten by a very skilful goalkeeper! We are really proud of you for representing us girls.



### Need to Know for September

#### **Start and Finish Times**

We have made the decision to make start times and finish times uniform for all classes from September. We will trial this during the first half term, and we will think really carefully about the doors we use so that it easy for parents to drop off/ collect more than one child.

#### Daily Uniform

- Red/ blue sweatshirt or cardigan, with or without school logo
- Trousers, skirts, culottes, shorts or pinafore dresses in dark grey / black, or gingham dresses in red or blue.
- A polo-shirt, shirt or blouse in white, red or blue.
- Shoes, boots or plain trainers in black.

#### **PE Uniform**

Pupils attend school in their PE Kit instead of their uniform on their PE days.

- Plain t-shirt in white
- Sports shorts, tracksuit bottoms or leggings in black with minimal branding
- A plain black hoodie (preferably unbranded)
- Trainers or plimsolls suitable for indoor and outdoor

Every child will also need a pair of wellies and waterproofs available to wear every day. These can stay in school through the week. If you have any old wellies/ waterproofs that your child has grown out of, we would be very grateful for donations so that we have some spares at school. There will be areas of the playground that are inaccessible to the children if they do not have wellies.

Pupils should not wear jewellery in school other than small stud earrings. Please note that pupils MUST remove their own jewellery for PE and sport.
