Parent & Carer Code of Conduct

Working together so all children can thrive

Unacceptable behaviours include:

- · Shouting, swearing, threats or aggression.

- Approaching or disciplining other people's children.
- · Making negative or defamatory posts on social media about staff or the school.
- · Smoking, vaping, alcohol or dogs on school premises.

This list gives examples and is not intended to cover every possible situation.

Remember: Together we create a safe, respectful, supportive environment for all.

We feel very lucky that the vast majority of communications we have with parents and carers are positive. It is so important that you feel able to talk to us and share concerns; we want you to do this and it is better for everyone if this is done in a respectful and courteous manner.

Please be assured that we never rush into decisions and that we are always trying to do our best for all of the children in the school.


