Anning Class



Jemison class have been working hard designing treasure maps this week! They have done an amazing job – I'm not sure I fancy a visit slimy swamp!








Today your child will be coming home with a Christmas card fundraising sheet.

Just a quick note about using Numbots. It is a fabulous resource to use at home and the children really do benefit from the reinforcement of making relationships between numbers and spotting patterns. I am aware that the time element can cause some panic in younger children so if you go to settings when your child logs in, you can turn off the visual timer on



the screen and Mr Gargiulo has extended the time to 3 x times the previous amount. This should help if your child worries about the time and is struggling to achieve the rewards.

In class, I have also been using a lot of the maths games on ICT games and Topmarks to help their maths understanding and keep it fun.
