### **Parent/Carer Consultations**

Thank you to all of you who have booked appointments for parent/ carer consultations. I am so sorry we had to delete the original bookings; we really do appreciate your patience, understanding and cooperation in re-booking appointments.

In response to parent voice gathered last year, the consultations are face to face this year and will take place in the school hall. Teachers will be sitting around the side of the hall and benches will be situated in the middle of the hall where you will be able to wait for your appointment, where children will be able to sit if they need to accompany you and for you to look through your children's books after your appointment. Please enter school via the main entrance, which we will leave open, and make your way through to the school hall.

The appointments are ten minutes long – we do need to be tight on timings to avoid impacting on other people's appointments. If your child is on the Special Educational Needs register, you should have been contacted to book a longer or separate appointment to review their Individual Education Plan (IEP). Please do let us know if an appointment for this has not yet been scheduled so that we can facilitate it.

#### Clubs next week

There have had to be some changes to clubs next week as a result of parent/ carer consultations. Multiskills will go ahead on Wednesday, but it will be outdoors so please ensure your child has their outdoor PE kit, and dance will be held in the classroom next to year 2 on Thursday.

### Staffing

We successfully appointed a teacher to cover Mrs Bradley's maternity leave before the half-term. Mrs Pilkington performed brilliantly in both her lesson and interview, showing real alignment with our vision and related values: we are certain she will be a fantastic member of the team. Mrs Bradley is intending to teach up until Christmas and Mrs Pilkington will take up her post from after Christmas.



We have arranged a number of visits between now and Christmas so that Mrs Bradley is able to handover to Mrs Pilkington and so Mrs Pilkington has the opportunity to get to know the children really well.

Mrs Elliott is recovering well and missing everyone at school. She is hoping to return to work after the Christmas Holidays. Mrs Lawrence will continue to teach the reception class alongside Mr Gargiulo until Mrs Elliott returns.

### PTA: What a great year of fundraising!

I would just like to thank each and everyone of you who were able to support the PTA either through volunteering or through spending money at the various events over the past year. You have helped to raise a lot of money and this has all gone back into the school to support the pupils with their education and enrichment.

Because of the money raised last year via the PTA, we have been able to create two new areas in school - a sensory room and a library.

The sensory area that we have managed to create is already providing the necessary space for pupils to interact with. We were able to buy a range of different sensory items such as a black out tent, bubble tube and sensory boards for hands and feet. It is a lovely and calm place that all children can use and access.





The library has been created in what was an unused classroom. The large space is perfect for the library and we are now able to take whole classes in at a time. Children have the space to relax and read as a group or enjoy a book alone in a quiet and calm spot. The funds raised have helped to buy colourful rugs, squishy beanbags and soft cushions to make a few cosy reading nooks. We have also purchased new chairs for children to use when they are sat in the library for studying. We know that the library will be well used and loved by all.











The funds raised by the PTA have also been used to pay for part of our OPAL program. OPAL is already having a huge impact on the quality of outdoor play and all children are thoroughly enjoying exploring our grounds and playing - even in the rain! (Please note that there will be an OPAL progress update in the coming weeks!)

This year all events will be focused on raising funds to purchase new Chromebooks, more books for Little Wandle, which support our phonics education, and also a range of specialty bikes to develop gross motor skills as part of our OPAL provision.

A huge thank you to everyone who continues to be a part of and supports the PTA - all the staff greatly appreciate your hard work and dedication to our school. Every pound spent at an event, is helping to grow our provision available for all pupils. You are all wonderful!

#### **OPAL - Wheels**

From next week, the children will be able to use a range of ride on toys such as scooters in a designated area of the playground. We showed the children how to use these safely in assembly today and explained where they could be used as well as speed expectations.

Children will not be wearing helmets whilst on these ride ons. This follows OPAL guidance, which states that as the children will not be near a road or riding at speed it is safer for them to be helmetless rather than wear a potentially badly fitted helmet.

OPAL produce clear guidance on a range of activities such as this which we make sure we take on board when completing our risk assessments – if you ever have any questions about this please don't hesitate to ask.



#### **Attendance**

We were really pleased to receive an email from the DFE this week naming us as a high performer for attendance compared to a group of similar schools. It said that our attendance outcomes are amongst the strongest in overall attendance and persistent absence and that we have been named so that other schools can seek advice from us.

We work really hard to make school a happy place where every child feels valued and welcomed and we were pleased to see this reflected in our attendance figures.




## Writing



There are always areas to work on – in particular we are going to have a look at our approach to handwriting to make sure that handwriting does not become a barrier for children as they become older.

















### **Fundraising for OSCAR'S**

If you or your child have any other ideas for fundraising opportunities do let us know and we will also talk to the children.


