Dear parent/ carer,

As I mentioned in last week's newsletter, you will have received your child's school attendance to date this week. Our attendance here is generally excellent and well above national average – thank you to all of you for making this happen. Nevertheless, it is still important we do everything we can to support children to attend school as often as possible – this is why we are investing so much time and energy into our OPAL provision and into ensuring our school has a culture of inclusion and an ethos of belonging: we want our children to be here, and we want them to want to be here, to love their time at school and know that they matter to us.

If your child is unwell, it is really important they remain home until they are well enough to attend school. If you are ever in doubt, this is a good guide: <https://www.nhs.uk/live-well/is-my-child-too-ill-for-school/>

We are required to report on, track and monitor children classed as persistent absentees, which means their attendance falls below 90%. 4.8% of our pupils are currently classed as persistent absentees. Whilst 90% is considered wonderful in most walks of life, an attendance below 90% means that the equivalent of at least one school day every two weeks is missed. If a child has more than 19 days off school in a year, they will be in this bracket and will inevitably miss out on lots of learning and social opportunities. I will be in touch today if your child's attendance is below 90% to see if there is anything we can do to support you or your child to attend school more regularly.

If your child's attendance is between 90 and 95%, please do let us know if there is anything else we can do to help, or if your child needs any additional support. We would much rather you let us know if there is a barrier to your child attending school, and are always happy to help in any way we can.

### Goodbye Mrs Perks

I suspect there won't be a dry eye in school today as we say goodbye to the wonderful Mrs Perks. Mrs Perks has worked here for six years and is a phenomenal teaching assistant, colleague and friend. If you are lucky enough to have a child that has been supported by Mrs Perks, you will be well aware of how amazing she is! She has provided incredible support to some of our most vulnerable learners, she is loved by the children in her class, she works so hard to support her colleagues and she is funny, kind and caring. She will be incredibly missed and we are really sad to see her go, but



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know she is moving on to an incredibly opportunity which is perfect for her. Thanks for everything Mrs Perks – you have been amazing!

For the remainder of this half term, year 2 will be supported by Mr Longmore on a Monday and Tuesday, who is a very experienced teacher, and Mrs Collins, who currently works in year 3/4, on Wednesday - Friday. We are hoping to recruit for the rest of the year shortly.

### **OPAL – update and large loose parts**

Autumn was a great start to OPAL with the many new areas for outdoor play. The children have really enjoyed the new digging and mud kitchen area and the wheels are a huge success! The joy of play at lunch is fantastic!

Thank you for providing wellies and waterproofs – we are in the process of having two new structures built (one for EYFS/KS1 and the other for KS2) including outdoor benches and wellie storage with a waterproof cover to make the changing of outdoor clothes a little easier. We will update on this as it progresses.

As part of our next phase with OPAL, we are looking to source a number of items called large loose parts. These will be used for making dens, hang out zones, obstacle courses, leaping and jumping zones, towers and many other play ideas that the children can create from their imagination. We are looking for the following; if you have any or know where we can source any from, then please do let us know. Please can we ask that no nails are in any wooden items. If you are able to provide any of the below, then please drop off at the main entrance. A huge thank you!

- Thick rope


... and much more! If you think we can use it, then please just ask.

## Yousafzai Class


